LESSON ONE: EQUITY AND JUSTICE

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will explore and identify issues of equity and justice through story-telling, active listening, and empathy exercises.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Language; Oral Communication 1.2 demonstrate an understanding of appropriate listening behaviour by adapting active listening strategies to suit a variety of situations, including work in groups
- Arts D1.1 create two- and three-dimensional works of art that express feelings and ideas inspired by their interests

LESSON TWO: INCLUSION & EXCLUSION

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will explore and apply strategies for respectful friendship, and understanding others in a collaborative simulation activity.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Language; Oral Communication 2.2 demonstrate an understanding of appropriate speaking behaviour in a variety of situations, including paired sharing and small-and large- group discussions
- Health and Physical Education C1.3 describe various types of bullying and abuse, including bullying using technology, and identify appropriate ways of responding

OBJECTIVE

Learners will develop conflict resolution skills and self efficacy in your classroom in hands-on activities, like games, drama, art and simulations.

MATERIALS

- Space: All activities can be done in your own classroom
- Tech: Device and projection for virtual facilitation video calls

LESSON THREE: COURAGE IN CONFLICT

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will explore and apply strategies to respond to social, physical and verbal conflict by role playing various conflict scenarios.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Health and Physical Education C1.3 describe various types of bullying and abuse, including bullying using technology, and identify appropriate ways of responding
- Language; Reading 1.1 read a variety of texts from diverse cultures, including literary texts, graphic texts, and informational texts
- Language; Reading 1.6 extend understanding of texts by connecting the ideas in them to their own knowledge, experience, and insights to other familiar texts, and to the world around them
- Arts B2.1 express personal responses and make connections to characters, themes, and issues presented in their own and others' drama works
- Social Studies A3.9 describe some key reasons why different groups in early societies cooperated or came into conflict at different times

LESSON FOUR: MINDFUL COURAGE

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will identify social or economic issues in their community, and explore strategies for response and social change using the design thinking process.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Social Studies B1.3 describe some key actions taken by both industries and citizens to address the need for more sustainable use of land and resources, and assess their effectiveness
- Social Studies B3.6 describe significant opportunities and challenges related to quality of life in some of Canada's political regions

LESSON FIVE: BUILDING COMMUNITY

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will identify elements of supportive communities and using strengths of a group through fine art and storytelling, and will apply those elements in a culminating cooperative game.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Social Studies A3.10 describe some attempts within early societies to deal with conflict and to establish greater cooperation
- Arts D2.1 interpret a variety of art works, and identify the feelings, issues, themes and social concerns that they convey
