Virtual Workshop Series Outline - Fall

LESSON ONE: IDENTITY

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will explore their unique personal identities, and apply strategies for respecting the identity of others in fine art and collaborative activities.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Health and Physical Education C3.3 describe how visible and invisible differences make each person unique and identify ways of showing respect for differences in others
- Arts D1.1 create two- and three-dimensional works of art that express personal feelings and ideas inspired by the environment or that have the community as their subject
- Arts D2.1 express personal feelings and ideas about art

LESSON TWO: COMMUNICATION

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will explore and apply communication and active listening strategies in cooperative games.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Health and Physical Education C1.3 identify characteristics of healthy relationships and describe ways of overcoming challenges in a relationship
- Language; Oral Communication 1.2 demonstrate an understanding of appropriate listening behaviour by using active listening strategies in order to contribute meaningfully and work constructively in groups
- Language; Oral Communication 1.3 identify a variety of listening comprehension strategies and use them appropriately before, during, and after listening in order to understand and clarify the meaning of oral texts

OBJECTIVE

Learners will develop conflict resolution skills and self efficacy in your classroom in hands-on activities, like games, drama, art and simulations.

MATERIALS

- Space: All activities can be done in your own classroom
- Tech: Device and projection for virtual facilitation video calls

LESSON THREE: CONFLICT STYLES

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will develop self-awareness strategies and will analyse styles conflict through cooperative activities.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Health and Physical Education C1.3 identify characteristics of healthy relationships and describe ways of overcoming challenges in a relationship
- Language; Oral Communication 1.6 extend understanding of oral texts by connecting the ideas in them to their own knowledge and experience; to other familiar texts, including print and visual texts; and to the world around them.

LESSON FOUR: EMPATHY

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will identify and apply strategies for building understanding of others, and showing mutual respect through storytelling and collaborative activities.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- Language; Oral Communication 1.4 demonstrate an understanding of the information and ideas in a variety of oral texts by identifying important information or ideas and some supportive details
- Language; Oral Communication 1.8 express personal opinions about ideas presented in texts
- Social Studies A3.7 describe how some different communities in Canada related to each other during this period with a focus on whether the relationships were characterized by cooperation

LESSON FIVE: WORKING TOGETHER

Conflict Resolution Strategies: Learners will identify and apply strategies for assertive speaking, honesty and overcoming challenges in experiential role play scenarios.

Curriculum Expectations Covered:

- L OC 2.2 demonstrate an understanding of appropriate speaking behaviour in a variety of situations including small- and large-group discussion
- Arts B1.1 engaged in a dramatic play and role play, with a focus on exploring themes, ideas, characters, and issues from imagination or in stories from diverse communities, times, and places
- Arts B1.2 demonstrate an understanding of how the element of time and place can support the development of role
- Arts B1.4 communicate feelings and ideas to a familiar audience using audio, visual or technological aids to support or enhance their drama work
- Arts B2.1 express thoughts, feelings, and ideas about a variety of drama experiences and performances
